- Make sure the blocks with the verses are in the right order.
- Repeat Verse
- Extra Bonus if repeated from memory with motions.

Balloons Flying High for Bravery

- Match the Bible Hero with the right story
- Share one lesson they have learned from each story

Chaos to Clarity

- Move Bible Verse out the bucket
- Hang them in the right order
- Repeat the verse from memory
- Bonus for using the motions at the same time.

Why Encouraging Words Matter:

During VBS, our preschoolers are not just learning Bible stories—they're also learning about God's love through *how we speak to them*. Positive, faith-filled words help build their confidence, teach them about God's character, and remind them they are loved and valued. By using simple affirmations while they play, we're planting seeds of faith and encouragement that will stay with them far beyond this week. Let's be intentional with our words and speak life into every child's heart.

General Encouragement (Use Anytime):

- "You are doing such a great job!"
- "God made you special and strong!"
- "I love how you're trying your best!"
- "You are such a great helper!"
- "Jesus loves you so much!"
- "Wow—you are showing kindness!"
- "God is smiling at you right now!"
- "Look how brave and joyful you are!"

Preschool Recreation Activity: Freeze Dance - "Fire!" Edition

Bible Story Tie-In: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the Fiery Furnace

Key Message: God was with them in the fire—they didn't burn, and they stood strong in their

faith!

Supplies Needed:

- Music player with upbeat worship or kids' songs
- Open space (indoors or outdoors)
- Setup Balloons on the Bowling Pins and create obstacles for the kids to dance through.

How to Play:

- 1. Gather the kids in a safe open space.
- 2. Start playing music and let the kids dance freely.
- 3. Pause the music at random intervals.
- 4. When the music stops, shout "FIRE!"
- 5. All the kids must *freeze* like statues (just like the 3 men stood firm in the fire).

Safety Tips:

- Make sure the dance area is free of obstacles.
- Remind children not to push or run.

Spiritual Application:

After the game, briefly say:

"Even when scary things happen, like a fiery furnace, we can remember that God is with us—just like He was with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. We can stand strong with God!"

6 General Encouragement For Freeze Dance (Fiery Furnace):

- "You're standing strong—just like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego!"
- "Wow! You froze so fast—you're paying attention so well!"
- "Even in the fire, God is with us!"
- "You're being so brave and still—great job trusting God!"

Preschool Recreation Activity: Royal Bubble Parade

Bible Story Tie-In: ****** Josiah the Child King

Key Message: God used young Josiah to clean up the temple and bring people back to Him.

Even kids can do big things for God!

Supplies Needed:

• Bubble machine & bubble guns

- Jay's 3D printed crowns (one for each child)
- Music (optional)
- Open space for marching and playing

How to Play:

- 1. Begin by letting the kids dance and play in the bubbles. Let them run, pop, and laugh!
- 2. When you call out "Royal Parade!", have all the children gather.
- 3. Hand each child their **crown** and say something like:

"You are God's special helper—just like King Josiah!"

- 4. Invite them to place their crowns on their heads and march in a circle through the bubbles, celebrating how Josiah helped clean up God's house.
- 5. Encourage them to "clean up the bubbles" as they walk, showing how God used Josiah to make things right again.

Spiritual Application (Short & Sweet):

"King Josiah was just a kid—but he helped clean up the temple and helped people love God again. You are never too little to do something big for God!"

W General Encouragement For Royal Bubble Parade (Josiah the Child King):

- "You're a royal helper of God!"
- "You're marching with joy—just like King Josiah obeyed with joy!"
- "Pop those bubbles with purpose!"
- "You wear your crown like a true child of God!"

Preschool Recreation Activity: Build the Wall!

Bible Story Tie-In: En Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall

Key Message: Nehemiah didn't give up! He worked hard with others to build God's wall. We

can work together too!

Supplies Needed:

- Cardboard boxes (shoebox size to large any kind will do!)
- Space to stack and move safely
- Cones to setup area to build in.

How to Play:

- 1. **Scatter the boxes** around the play area.
- 2. Tell the kids they are "Nehemiah's little helpers" and they need to **rebuild the wall** just like he did.
- 3. Set a "building area" (use tape or cones to mark it).
- 4. When you say "Go!" the kids carry one box at a time to the wall area and stack it carefully.
- 5. While building, leaders can say encouraging things like:

"Great job working together!"

Spiritual Application (Preschool-Friendly):

"Nehemiah built the wall even when people tried to stop him. He didn't give up—and with God's help, we don't give up either!"

General Encouragement For Build the Wall (Nehemiah):

- "You're working hard—just like Nehemiah!"
- "You didn't give up—what a strong builder!"
- "God gives us strength to keep going!"
- "You're helping build something special for God!"

Preschool Recreation Activity: Giant Grapes Relay

Bible Story Tie-In: 🐐 Joshua and Caleb Explore the Promised Land

Key Message: Joshua and Caleb trusted God! They saw good things in the land and believed God would help them.

Supplies Needed:

- 2–4 pool noodles (to use as "grape-carrying poles")
- Purple balloons tied together to form large grape clusters
- Cones or tape to mark start and return points

How to Play:

- 1. Set up a **start line** and a **"grape zone"** a short distance away (like 10–15 feet).
- 2. Divide the children into 2 or more teams or just take turns in pairs.
- 3. Two children work together: each one holds one end of the **pool noodle**, with the balloon "grape cluster" hanging in the middle (like in the Bible story!).
- 4. On "Go!", the pairs **carry the grapes carefully** from the grape zone back to the starting line without dropping them.
- 5. When they return, everyone cheers, and the next pair goes!
- 6. Keep it non-competitive—focus on teamwork and bravery.

Spiritual Application (Preschool Level):

"Joshua and Caleb went into the land and brought back big grapes! They weren't scared—they knew God was with them. When we trust God, we can be brave too!"

description General Encouragement For Giant Grapes Relay (Joshua & Caleb):

- "You're such a brave explorer!"
- "You're carrying those grapes just like Joshua and Caleb!"
- "God helps us be strong and not afraid!"
- "You trusted your partner—that's teamwork!"

Encouraging Younger Children During Play:

Younger children thrive on positive reinforcement and need to know they are seen, valued, and loved—especially during play. As they participate in games, take every opportunity to speak life into them with words like "Great try!" or "You're doing such a good job listening!" Reinforce their effort, teamwork, and bravery, not just performance. Remind them that making mistakes is okay and that God loves a willing heart. Your encouragement helps them build confidence, learn God's truths, and feel safe to keep trying.

Encouraging Effort and Participation

- "I love how you're trying your best!"
- "That was a great move—way to go!"
- "You're doing such a good job staying focused!"
- "Keep going—you've got this!"
- "I see how hard you're working—awesome job!"

Building Confidence

- "You're stronger than you think!"
- "God made you brave and smart!"
- "You're a great team player!"
- "You remembered the rules—that's amazing!"
- "You're showing great leadership!"

Reinforcing Spiritual Lessons

- "You're standing strong—just like our Bible hero today!"
- "You're helping just like Nehemiah's team!"
- "That was a kind choice—God loves that!"
- "You trusted your partner—great faith like Joshua and Caleb!"
- "You're being a great example—just like King Josiah!"



Obstacle Course Game: "Through the Fiery Furnace"

Bible Story Tie-In: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego **Theme Focus:** Standing strong in faith even in the fire

Supplies Needed:

- Red, orange, and yellow **balloons** (at least 10–15)
- Box fan or small floor fan to keep balloons in motion
- Cones and hoops to guide the obstacle path
- Spray Paint.
- Music.

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Create a winding **obstacle path** using spray paint.
- 2. Place hoops along the way as "prayer stations" where kids must pause.
- 3. Place the **balloons in the center** or throughout the course as moving "fire."
- 4. Set up the **fan** at one end to keep balloons gently moving across the path.
- 5. Play dramatic or worship music in the background.

How to Play:

- 1. One child at a time will attempt to make it through the **Fiery Furnace** without touching any balloons.
- 2. If they accidentally touch a balloon (aka "fire"), they must freeze, take a deep breath, and say:

"God is with me!"

Then continue.

- 3. When they reach the end, they cheer "God was with them in the fire!"
- 4. Let every child go through once or twice, and encourage cheering for each other!

Spiritual Application (K–2 Level):

"Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego didn't give up or give in. Even when it looked dangerous, they knew God was with them. We can stand strong too!"

Game: "Spy Out the Land!"

Bible Story Tie-In: Joshua & Caleb – The 12 Spies

Theme Focus: Trusting God and seeing the good in what He's promised

Supplies Needed:

- Cones (to mark "spy zones" and travel paths)
- Bean bags (as "spy reports" or "grape clusters")
- Buckets labeled with: "Milk," "Honey," "Grapes," "Blessings"
- Optional: balloons tied in clusters as grapes or signs with "giants" to avoid

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Create 3–4 spy zones using cones—each zone represents part of the Promised Land.
- 2. Place buckets at the end of the course (1 per team or all together) with labels like "Grapes," "Honey," "Milk" to represent God's blessings.
- 3. Place bean bags in the spy zones—they must "collect" them and deliver them to the right blessing bucket.
- 4. Add optional balloon "grapes" at the end to decorate and reinforce the visual.

How to Play:

- 1. Divide children into teams or pairs (or let them rotate individually).
- 2. The goal is to "spy out the land," grab a bean bag (spy report), and carry it back to the correct bucket.
- 3. If using teams: have one "spy" run out and one "helper" stay back to encourage and cheer.
- 4. Repeat until all bean bags are returned.

Game Goal:

To gather as many "good things" from the land as possible—and show courage like Joshua and Caleb!

Spiritual Application (K–2 Level):

"Joshua and Caleb saw that the land was good, and they trusted that God would help them—no matter what! We can trust God's promises too!"

🧱 Game: "Builders & Blockers" – Nehemiah's Wall Challenge

Bible Story Tie-In: Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall

Theme Focus: Working together and staying focused on what God has called you to do

Supplies Needed:

- Large boxes (shoebox to medium size) for wall bricks
- Cones to mark off building and tossing zones
- Bean bags as "distractions" or "blockers"
- Large bowling pins optional obstacles or "people who tried to stop the work"
- Optional: music to set a building pace

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Divide the space into **two zones**: a building zone and a toss zone.
- 2. Stack the boxes in the build zone to start the "wall".
- 3. Set up 2–3 children as **builders**, while 1–2 children stand a short distance away in the **blocker zone**.
- 4. Give the blockers bean bags—they'll gently toss them to try to knock down the wall (just like enemies tried to stop Nehemiah).
- 5. Builders must **keep rebuilding** as the wall gets knocked down—working as a team and cheering each other on!

How to Play:

- 1. Start a 2-minute timer (or use music for timing).
- 2. While the "blockers" try to knock down parts of the wall with bean bags, the builders keep rebuilding as fast as they can.
- 3. After the time ends, switch roles so everyone gets a turn.

Game Goal:

To keep the wall standing by rebuilding together, no matter what comes their way!

Spiritual Application (K–2 Level):

"Nehemiah didn't let anything stop him. He trusted God and kept going. We can keep doing what's right—even when it's hard or others try to stop us."

W Game: "Clean the Temple Toss"

Bible Story Tie-In: Josiah the Child King (2 Kings 22–23)

Theme Focus: Choosing what is right and honoring God with our hearts

Supplies Needed:

- Buckets or laundry baskets (labeled)
- Bean bags
- Paper labels or signs with words like:
 - o 🔽 Prayer | God's Word | Worship | Kindness
 - X Lies | Selfishness | Idols | Disobedience
- Hoops or cones to create a tossing line

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Create **two sets of buckets**: one labeled **"Good for God's Temple"** and the other **"Not for God's Temple."**
- 2. Tape or pin the labels inside or in front of each bucket so kids can clearly see which is which.
- 3. Place the buckets 5–6 feet away from the toss line (adjust for ability).
- 4. Mix the bean bags and assign "behaviors" or "items" to them using tags or stickers (optional, for extra clarity).

How to Play:

- 1. One at a time, children take a bean bag and **decide** which bucket it belongs in.
- 2. They toss it into either the **Good Bucket** or the **Bad Bucket**, based on the word on the bag or on your verbal prompt.
- 3. If they get it right, everyone cheers! If it's tricky, pause and explain briefly why it doesn't belong.
- 4. Rotate turns until everyone has tossed 2–3 bags.

Variation for Fun:

- Let them wear their crown from Josiah's activity
- Add a relay style: run to pick a bag, run back and toss it

Reinforce the lesson by celebrating behaviors that reflect courage, teamwork, and faith. These quick moments of connection help the children see that following God applies to every part of life—even play.

Game: "Fireball Disc Golf Challenge"

Bible Story Tie-In: Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the Fiery Furnace

Theme Focus: Standing strong in faith when under pressure

Supplies Needed:

2 Disc Golf baskets

- Red, orange, and yellow bean bags or small flying discs ("fireballs")
- Cones to create throwing lines

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Set up 2 disc golf baskets (or buckets) as "rescue zones" at a distance.
- 2. Create a few obstacle zones using cones and streamers—players must throw from behind
- 3. Scatter "fireballs" (bean bags or discs) across the course to be collected and thrown into the rescue zones.
- 4. Assign teams and give them a set time (2–3 minutes) to get as many fireballs into the baskets as possible.

How to Play:

- 1. Teams compete to collect "fireballs" from the fiery zone and throw them into the disc golf baskets.
- 2. Each team sends one runner at a time to grab a fireball, run back, and toss it.
- 3. Add a twist: "Freeze Zones" (like in the furnace)—leaders can call out "FREEZE" and kids must pause for 3 seconds, just like the three men stood still in the fire.

Spiritual Application:

Just like the three men stood firm in the fiery furnace, we can keep our faith strong when we're under pressure—because God is always with us.

Game: "Promised Land Relay: Grapes & Giants"

Bible Story Tie-In: Joshua & Caleb spy out the land (Numbers 13)

Theme Focus: Trusting God even when others are afraid

Supplies Needed:

- Pool noodles (as carrying poles)
- Balloon "grape clusters" (tied in bunches with string)
- Cones (to create an obstacle course)
- Buckets labeled: "Grapes," "Milk," "Honey," "Blessings"

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Create a winding **obstacle course** with cones.
- 2. Set up the balloon grape clusters at the far end of the course in a "fruit zone."
- 3. Set up a **finish line** with labeled buckets.

How to Play:

- 1. Players work in pairs. Each pair carries one balloon grape cluster between them using a pool noodle (like Joshua and Caleb did).
- 2. They must navigate the cone path without dropping the grapes
- 3. When they reach the end, they deposit their grapes in a blessing bucket and tag the next pair or do it again until all buckets are filled.

Spiritual Application:

Joshua and Caleb didn't let fear stop them. They believed God's promise and encouraged others to follow Him. We can choose faith over fear too—even when the world says "Turn back!"

Game: "Builders & Distracters – Defend the Wall!"

Bible Story Tie-In: Nehemiah Rebuilds the Wall (Nehemiah 2–6)

Theme Focus: Staying focused and faithful, even when others try to stop you

Supplies Needed:

- Large cardboard boxes (for wall bricks)
- Cones (to mark zones)
- Bean bags (as "distractions" or "enemy attacks")
- Bowling pins (optional: used as towers or extra obstacles)
- Optional: pool noodles for added roles (like "protectors")

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Divide the group into **two teams**:
 - o **Builders** build the wall
 - o **Distracters** try to knock it down with bean bags
- 2. Mark off the **building zone** and the **throwing line** for the distracters (at least 10–15 feet back).
- 3. Stack the boxes in a basic wall shape—but incomplete. Builders will need to finish it under pressure.
- 4. Use cones to define the play area boundaries.

How to Play:

- 1. Builders must race to stack the boxes and **rebuild the wall** in the center of the zone.
- 2. Distracters toss bean bags from behind the line to try and **knock bricks down**—they represent opposition (like Sanballat and Tobiah).
- 3. The wall must be completed in **3 minutes** without falling. If a piece is knocked down, builders can rebuild it.
- 4. Optional: assign 1 player per team as a "**Protector**" who uses a pool noodle to block bean bags without stepping over the builder line.
- 5. Switch roles after each round so everyone plays both sides.

Spiritual Application:

Nehemiah didn't stop building, even when people mocked or attacked him. He stayed focused on what God told him to do—and we can do the same when people try to distract us or tear us down.

Game: "Temple Toss – Choose What's Right"

Bible Story Tie-In: Josiah the Child King (2 Kings 22–23)

Theme Focus: Choosing to obey God and remove what doesn't belong

Supplies Needed:

- Buckets or baskets labeled:
 - o Keep
 - o Remove
- Water Balloons (write behaviors/words on them using tape or labels)
- Cones or hoops to mark toss lines

Set-Up Instructions:

- 1. Set up 2 buckets across the play area—labeled with **good choice** and **bad behaviors**.
- 2. Place a toss line using cones or hoops about 6–10 feet back, adjusted for difficulty.
- 3. Lay out balloons with behavior labels (good and bad mixed).

How to Play:

- 1. Each child takes 3–5 bean bags per round.
- 2. They read each one and **decide where it belongs**—in a good bucket or bad bucket.
- 3. They toss the bag into the correct bucket.
- 4. If they get it right, their team earns a point.

Spiritual Application:

Josiah chose to follow God and clean up the temple, even though he was young. We can choose to do what's right, remove what doesn't belong in our hearts, and lead others to honor God too.

Each recreation activity below is designed to build on the stories shared during Bible time. The goal is to deepen understanding through play, teamwork, and reflection. Encourage conversation, teamwork, and faith-based application as the children participate.

Why Encouragement Matters:

Words of encouragement do more than boost confidence—they help preteens connect what they're learning with how they're living. Positive, faithfilled reinforcement affirms that their choices, effort, and teamwork matter. When leaders call out courage, kindness, or perseverance during a game, it strengthens both the lesson and the child's identity in Christ. - 4. Drop grapes in the blessing bucket.
- 5. Return to get more grapes.
- 6. Team is finished when they have grapes in each bucket.



Preschool (Ages 3–4)

Key Phrase: "I can be brave because God is with me!"

- Keep it short: "Two men, Joshua and Caleb, said, 'Let's go! God will help us!' But the other men were scared."
- Activity: March in place like they're going to the Promised Land!
- Question: "Who helps us be brave?" (God!)

Younger Children (K–2nd Grade)

Key Point: Joshua and Caleb believed God would help them win.

- Tell the story with pictures or objects (e.g., a big grape cluster)
- Question: "What should we do when everyone else is afraid?"

Older Children (3rd–4th Grade)

Preschool (Ages 3–4)

Key Phrase: "God is with me!"

- Tell it simply: "Three friends loved God. The king said, 'Bow down!' But they said, 'No!' The king got mad and threw them into fire. But God was with them!"
- Activity: Act out standing tall when others bow
- Question: "Who is always with us?" (God!)

Younger Children (K–2nd Grade)

Key Point: We can stand strong for God.

- Memory Motion: "Be strong" flex muscles!
- Question: "Would you stand up for God even when it's hard?"

Older Children (3rd–4th Grade)

Key Point: These three men obeyed God, no matter what.

- Read aloud parts of Daniel 3
- Discuss: "What kinds of 'fires' or hard times might we go through?"
- Reflect: "How can I stand strong even when it's hard?"

Pre-Teen (5th-6th Grade)

Key Point: Faith means trusting God in the heat of challenges.

- Deeper Bible exploration: What gave them that kind of boldness?
- Discussion: "What's a situation where someone today has to stand for what's right?"
- Application: "What would I do if I had to choose between being liked and standing for God?"

Story 3: Josiah the Child King – Obeying God at Any

Age

Scripture: 2 Kings 22–23

Main Truth: You're never too young to do what's right.

Make a throne and a scroll for the props.

Preschool (Ages 3–4)

Key Phrase: "I can follow God!"

- Simple version: "Josiah was a little boy—just 8 years old! He became king and loved God. He helped people love God too!"
- Activity: March like a little king or queen; pretend to clean up the temple
- Question: "Can you love God even if you're small?" (Yes!)

Younger Children (K–2nd Grade)

Key Point: Josiah made good choices and obeyed God.

- Use toy crown or robe to help them "become King Josiah"
- Question: "What are some good choices you can make this week?"

Older Children (3rd–4th Grade)

Use the wall, shield and sword.

Preschool (Ages 3–4)

Key Phrase: "I can help!"

- Tell it simply: "Nehemiah saw a wall that was broken. He prayed to God and said, 'I want to help!' And God helped him fix it!"
- Question: "Who helps us when we have a big job?" (God!)

Younger Children (K–2nd Grade)

Key Point: God gives us strength to finish what we start.

• Question: "What's something hard you've done with God's help?"

Older Children (3rd–4th Grade)

Key Point: Nehemiah didn't let distractions stop him.

- Read Nehemiah 4:6–9, 6:3
- Discussion: "What distractions do we face when we're trying to do the right thing?"
- Reflect: "When do I need to stay focused like Nehemiah?"

Pre-Teen (5th–6th Grade)

Key Point: Nehemiah stayed focused on God's mission—even when others tried to stop him.

- Deep dive: Explore how Nehemiah responded to opposition, fear, and ridicule
